Our data collection supporting our Site Improvement work continues every day. We have been thrilled recently with our reading results. I have included a snapshot graph that outlines our ongoing improvement in reading. Over the last two years we have made significant changes to the tools we use and the way we teach reading, particularly in our early years classes. Our staff have worked tirelessly to ensure that our students are receiving the

highest quality teaching and we are excited to continue this work. In 2021, we will be extending the InitiaLit approach into Year2, so all students in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 will receive this evidence based explicit instruction.

On the 28th of October the Year 7's went to the High School to have their first transition visit. They had a double lesson of PE and were introduced to the High School's Volleyball program.

Foster carers help provide support and care to our region's most vulnerable children and young people. They play a significant role in welcoming young people from the local area into their homes and families to ensure they have access to familiar schools, sporting activities, friends and relatives. Carers can choose to provide long-term, short-term, respite or occasional care. By joining AC.Care's network, carers also have ongoing support from a team based in the Riverland, providing specific training and 24/7 on-call support services. It takes many different people to provide sustainable placements for children of all ages, from infants through to teenagers. Foster carers can be of any gender, single or in a relationship, with or without children and there are options to balance working with foster care.
