We were very excited to welcome our 2021 Receptions to begin their transition process with us, last week. The transitioning students were very settled and enjoyed their first visits to school, integrating well with the current Receptions. We particularly appreciated being able to host a meeting for our new parents and while we were unable to hold our traditional morning tea, it was lovely to be able to meet and talk through what beginning school will look like for their children in 2021. Having a new student starting school is particularly exciting, whether it be your first child attending school or subsequent children, so it was good for our new parents to be able to meet, discuss and ask questions. Following the transition mornings on Tuesday and Wednesday of this week, there will be a final session next week.


