




Interschool Swimming Carnival



Please remember to return your photo envelopes whether you wish to have photos taken or not of your child/ren.


If you wish to have family photos taken please collect a family photo envelope from the front office. Spare or extra envelopes will also be available at the front office if required.

Mardi Gras 2021



Loxton Primary School will be joining in with the Loxton Mardi Gras parade which is on Saturday February the 27th. As in past years we are asking for as many of our students as possible to join in and walk with our school float. The Mardi Gras theme this year is 'Nature'. We would like our students to wear their favourite camping clothes, life jackets, fishing attire, floppy hats, cork hats, flannelette shirts, boots, fishing rods (no hooks) marshmallows on a stick, little swags on backs.... Please remember to put on sunscreen and bring a water bottle and a hat.

This year's Mardi Gras will look a bit different. It will be held around Loxton Oval #2 (next to Footy Oval). Students are asked to meet at the 'Preparation Area' (old Side Show Alley) to hop on the float (see map) at 10.30am. After the parade- please meet the float at the 'School float disembark point' (see map) to collect your child/ren at 11.30am



Everyone entering the Oval Precinct will need to pre-register ONLINE by visiting the Mardi Gras homepage at www.loxtonmardigras.org.au

Pre-registration is simple, quick and **FREE**. You will need to book tickets for **every** person that is coming in your group/family- each child, each parent/ caregiver/ spectator etc.

Your tickets will then be emailed to you. You can either print your tickets or show them on your smartphone. On arrival at the Main Entry Gate 1 (see map) you just show your tickets to the gate staff who will quickly scan and confirm your entry.

You will also have to QR code or manually write contact tracing details as per SA Health requirements. Tickets MIGHT be available at the gate on the day for people who haven't booked-but can't be guaranteed if the event is full (due to Covid Restrictions.)

School QR Code

Our school has been issued with a QR Code which you will find on classroom and building doors. In accordance with the SA Health and government guidelines please remember to sign in when on school grounds. Please continue to bring your child/ren's personal labelled water bottle which can be refilled at our drinking stations, rather than drinking directly from them.

Please be aware if you are entering the school premises for an extended time you will still need to sign in through the front office.


